



RECRUITMENT REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- To participate in the Spring 2024 Recruitment process, PNMs must register through the official Baylor Panhellenic Recruitment Registration link.
- Registration opens on August 21st, at 8 am and closes on December 6th, at midnight

- The Recruitment Registration fee is \$55.00.
- Once you start registration, you are unable to save and come back later to finish. It needs to all be completed in one sitting.



NO exceptions will be made after the closure of the Recruitment Registration period. If a PNM has not registered for Recruitment by 11:59PM on the last day of recruitment registration (December 6th,), she will be unable to participate in the Spring 2024 Recruitment process. Absolutely no extensions will be granted to the registration period.

WHAT ARE PNM MEETINGS?

Potential New Member Meetings (PNM Meetings) are a new addition this year hosted by Panhellenic Recruitment Team! These meetings will be an introduction to Primary Recruitment and support the preparation of PNM's as we prepare for formal recruitment week. These meetings will share information about what to expect throughout primary recruitment week in combination with learning more about each of the 9 unique chapters that make up Baylor's Panhellenic Community. GREEK VOCABULARY

Active/Initiate: a member who is initiated into lifelong fraternity or sorority membership and is a member in good standing at the collegiate or national level

<u>Alumnae/Alumni:</u> two or more sorority or fraternity members who have graduated from college

<u>Bid:</u> a formal invitation to join a fraternity or sorority

Bid Day: last day of membership recruitment, which includes acceptance parties

Brother/Sister: term used by active members when referring to each other Chapter: the collegiate group of a national fraternity/sorority, designated by a special Greek name Formal Recruitment: period of structured membership selection Initiation: the formal ceremony that marks the transition from new member status to full membership Legacy: a son/daughter, brother/sister of a fraternity/sorority member **MRABA:** The Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA), is a one-year binding agreement signed by a potential new member when ranking chapters after the final round of Preference events during the Formal Recruitment process. Prior to signing the MRABA, PNMs have several options to consider and reflect on with regard to membership options.

NPC: the National Panhellenic Conference in which all nine Baylor sororities are members. NPC is the coordinating body of all college Panhellenic Associations in the United States and Canada (NPC History). Orientation/New Member Education: a time in which the new members learn about the sorority or fraternity, its members, and chapter activities at the local, national, and international levels Philanthropy: a community service and/or fundraising project sponsored by a chapter.

New Member (formerly known as Pledge): a member of a fraternity or sorority not yet initiated

Prospective/Potential New Member

(PNM): a non-sorority or non-fraternity undergraduate who attends recruitment activities

<u>Quota</u>: the number of new members a Panhellenic sorority may take in one new member class

Recommendation: a written statement in support of a woman for a sorority written by an alumna member of that organization **Recruitment Counselor (Gamma Chi):**

Panhellenic Greek woman who guides prospective members through the membership recruitment process. <u>Silence:</u> period of time with no contact between sororities and potential members

LETTERS OF RECOMMEDNATION

A letter of recommendation (also referred to as LOR, REC, or RIF) is a letter or statement recommending a woman for membership. A LOR is written by an alumna member of a sorority. This serves as your introduction to the sorority, so their members can get to know you in advance of primary recruitment in the spring. It is sent to the specific Baylor chapter that the alumna is affiliated with

ARE LOR'S REQUIRED?

Baylor Panhellenic does not require that PNMs have LORS. Individual sororities may have specific requirements

We recommend that PNMs have one recommendation per chapter that requests LORs. Having more than one WILL NOT necessarily increase your chances of joining that sorority. It is 100% okay if you can't find a recommendation for every chapter!

Every chapter has different requirements on LOR, LOS, and RIF. **Make sure to check the requirements from each individual chapter!!** There is no official deadline for these forms! But, we HIGHLY encourage you to get all LORs, LOS & RIFs submitted before Thanksgiving Break! Chapters need time to read and organize all of these!

PNM & ACTIVE CONTACT RULES

These rules help ensure that potential new members have the most equitable & unbiased recruitment experience over the course of the fall semester! These rules begin June 1st

- No more than 4 active members can be in the presence of one PNM at a time
- A PNM may not tag or post with an active member on social media (and vice versa). This includes but is not limited to Instagram, Snapchat, BeReal, Tik Tok, Facebook, etc.
 - No actives or PNMs may "add" each other on Snapchat, effective June 1st.
 - No actives or PNMs can include each other on "private" or "close friends" stories, effective June 1st.
- Active members may not comment or "react to" PNM social media posts
- Group texts including both PNMs and actives is allowed, as long as the number of actives included does not exceed 4
- Active members may not contact or be with a PNM between the hours of 12am-7am
 - No sleepovers between actives and PNMS
- Active members may not spend money on a PNM (No buying gifts, coffee, sonic drinks, food, etc!)



BID PROMISING

WHAT IS IT?

Bid Promising is communicating via social media, texting, verbally, etc., with a potential new member implying that they will receive a bid for membership. Bid promising is not tolerated by the Baylor Panhellenic Council as no member should be promising membership.

EXAMPLES

"(insert chapter name) would love to have you." "Don't worry, you are already in "

"Don't worry, you are already in." "We would love to have you live in this house next year" "We/I can't wait to see you on Bid Day." "You would look great in (insert chapter colors/letters here), etc."

*If you hear of bid promising or if you are promised a bid, we ask that you let the recruitment team know ASAP! <u>This will not harm your</u> <u>recruitment</u> *

As a potential new member, you deserve all the rights listed below. If a member of the Panhellenic community fails to treat you with these rights, please contact the recruitment team immediate

- The right to be treated as an individual.
- The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process.
- The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from recruitment counselors and members.
- The right to be treated with respect.
- The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized.
- The right to ask how and why and receive straight answers.
- The right to have and express opinions to recruitment counselors.
- The right to have inviolable confidentiality when sharing information with recruitment counselors.
- The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others.
- The right to be fully informed about the NPC Unanimous Agreements implicit in the membership recruitment acceptance binding agreement (MRABA) signing process.
- The right to make one's own choice and decision and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision.
- The right to have a positive, safe, and enriching recruitment and new member experience.

DIVERSITY EQUITY & INCLUSION

The Panhellenic Women of Baylor University strive for diversity, equity, and inclusion above all else by promoting and exemplifying these principles in our words and actions. TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL RECRUITMENT



- Be relaxed, be yourself, and have fun!
- Form your opinions on chapters based on the conversations you have with individual members! Avoid making decisions based on material things such as chapter décor or clothing.
- Disregard rumors that you hear and make decisions based on your own feelings and experiences you have during recruitment it's the best way to ensure you are happy with the chapter you join 3.5 years later!
- Don't be pressured to join a particular chapter because of a parent, sibling, friend, significant other, or companion.
- Report anything that violates your PNM Bill of Rights or makes you feel uncomfortable to the Panhellenic recruitment team. You are entitled to having an enjoyable recruitment experience, and anything that keeps you from doing so is something that Panhellenic should be aware of to ensure that it doesn't happen in the future. When a report is filed, your name will not be noted.
- Keeping notes will ensure that you make fully informed decisions throughout the week!
- Have personal downtime and don't let yourself get burned out too quickly! Recruitment is a long week, and you should give yourself free time.
- Keep your opinions about recruitment and specific chapters to yourself in order to not impact another person's selection process.
- Rely on your Gamma Chis! Don't be intimidated by your Gamma Chis or anyone on the Panhellenic Recruitment Team, they are here to help you and make your recruitment week the best week possible!



IS THERE A "SILENCE PERIOD DURING RUSH WEEK?

Yes! The days leading up to and during recruitment week, active members will no longer be able to communicate with PNMs via social media or through in person communication outside of the recruitment process. This silence period ensures that active members do not influence PNM decisions during the recruitment process.

IF I AM A LEGACY FOR MY RELATIVE'S SORORITY CAN I GUARANTEE I WILL GET IN?

Although being a legacy can be helpful in networking within the Panhellenic community, there is no guarantee that a PNM will gain membership in a sorority based on their relationship to an alumna for a specific chapter.



IS IT OK IF I'M IN A BIBLE STUDY OR CLASS STUDY GROUP WITH MORE THAN 4 ACTIVE MEMBERS IN A SORORITY?

We ask that all PNMs and actives follow the rule that no more than four actives members can be in the presence of one PNM. In situations regarding church and school projects, we ask that everyone uses discernment to ensure that the relationships being built have no ties to an active members chapter or status in the Panhellenic community.

DO I HAVE TO HAVE LOR'S FOR EVERY CHAPTER TO BE CONSIDERED FOR MEMBERSHIP?

Every chapter in the Baylor Panhellenic community has specific requirements for letters of recommendation, RIF forms, and letters of support. Some chapters will not grant membership if a PNM does not have one of these documents turned in. Check out the "chapter specific requirements" page above to view what each chapter must have for a PNM to gain membership.



PARENT INFORMATION

Who can forget about the people who do it all for us? Parents! Here is your page :)

HELP WITH LETTERS OF RECOMENDATION

Do not be afraid to reach out to friends or post on facebook and asking if people would be willing to write your daughter a recommendation letter for a chapter. You have more connections than you might think!

FINANCES

Being an active member of a sorority can be expensive! It is best to have this conversation early in the process. There are multiple ways to set up payment plans for chapter dues and New Member dues. Feel free to email Panhellenic recruitment team about any specific questions on finances

ENCOURGAMENT

Rushing can be an emotional and long process. Sometimes your daughter will just need someone to talk to about where her head is at in the recruitment process. Even if you have not gone through recruitment yourself, be willing to understand this process and be patient with your daughter. Sometimes this might feel like the end of the world (even though we know it is not!)

BID DAY

Bid Day is such an exciting and emotional filled day, so having a supporter will be so important for these PNMs. If possible, we would love to have a family member or two be there for these PNMs! More information will be shared on our Instagram closer to January 13th
